Wicked Women: Three Female Mystics and Martyrs Who Can Teach Us About the Meaning of Jesus's Crucifixion

On the three Sundays leading up to Easter, Sid will be doing a series on female mystics and martyrs in the Christian tradition as a way to highlight the actions Jesus undertook that led to his execution by Roman authorities.
